An oral DNA sample has the ability to detect over 11 different strains of dangerous bacteria that can dwell in the mouth. Each of these bacterium has been identified as causative trigger for periodontal disease, gum infections and gingivitis. Patients without any symptoms of gum disease may find they are at risk for serious infections when these bacterium are present.

"In 20 years of practicing as a dentist, I have never felt so confident about prescribing a specific or combination of antibiotics to target exact disease causing organisms," said Dr. Gallardo.

The painless, noninvasive oral DNA test can provide extensive information on the mouth's health. DNA STRIP technology from Hain Lifescience provides a high sensitivity result and maximum specificity for existing bacterium. During the exam, saliva is collected on the specialized strip, which is then sent in for analysis. A full, written report will be ready for review in seven to ten days.

The oral DNA test is recommended for those who have a high risk for gum disease, such as parents or siblings with the disease, as well as for anyone who wants to know if they are at risk for periodontal disease to develop. Patients with gingivitis or early signs of gum disease can also benefit by determining if the bacterium that can cause serious periodontal infections is present.

Left untreated, periodontal disease will do more than damage the teeth and gums. The aggressive bacterium can release toxins within the body, causing significant issues with the overall health. Late stage periodontal disease has been shown to cause heart disease and strokes.

Dr. Gallardo and Dr. Lamas are proponents for proactive dental care for early detection and treatment of gum disease and periodontal disease, as well as other issues like oral cancer.
